“Stop the Spread” Testing Extended and MassNotify Established

The Baker-Polito Administration announced an extension of the “Stop the Spread” COVID-19 initiative, which provides free COVID-19 testing through September 30, 2021. Testing is an important public health tool, in addition to contact tracing, complying with public health mitigation measures such as face coverings, physical distancing, staying home when sick, and good hygiene, to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

The Stop the Spread initiative is a data-driven effort to reduce the prevalence of COVID-19 in communities across the Commonwealth. All state residents may visit the locations even if they do not reside in the town or city where the testing is being conducted.

In addition to the “Stop the Spread” extension, the Commonwealth has also established MassNotify, a new tool that works through smartphones, with a focus on privacy, to alert users who may have been exposed to COVID-19. FEMA COVID-19 Funeral Assistance Aids Grieving Families

COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA is providing financial assistance for COVID-19 related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

To be eligible for funeral assistance, the death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia. The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19, and the applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020. There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include an official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia, funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened, and proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs.

We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources. For more information, visit <https://www.fema.gov/disasters/coronavirus/economic/funeral-assistance>

Baker-Polito Administration to Lift COVID Restrictions May 29

The Baker-Polito Administration announced that the Commonwealth is on track to meet the goal of vaccinating 4.1 million residents by the first week of June and all remaining COVID-19 restrictions will be lifted effective May 29.

The Commonwealth's face covering order will also be rescinded on May 29. The Department of Public Health will issue a new face covering advisory consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's updated guidance. Face coverings will still be mandatory for all individuals on public and private transportation systems (including rideshares, livery, taxi, ferries, MBTA, Commuter Rail and transportation stations), in healthcare facilities and in other settings hosting vulnerable populations, such as congregate care settings. Governor Charlie Baker will end the State of Emergency June 15.

The Administration also announced updates to revise face covering requirements for youth and amateur sports and other guidance relating to childcare programs and K-12 schools. The Administration will release updated guidance for summer camps effective May 29. The Administration is able to take these steps to reopen the Commonwealth's economy because Massachusetts is on track to meet the goal set in December to fully vaccinate over 4 million individuals by the first week of June. The Commonwealth leads the nation in vaccinating residents, with 75% of adults receiving at least one dose. To date, over 4 million residents have received a first dose, with 3.2 million fully vaccinated. New cases have dropped by 89% since January 8. COVID hospitalizations are down 88% since January 1 and the positive test rate is down by 88% from peaking at 8.7% on January 1 to 1% today. COVID-19 Small Business Grant Program Aids Local Economy

ATTENTION METHUEN SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS: The City of Methuen has committed up to \$375,000 in one-time funds to create a Small Business Relief Fund Program. The objective of this program is to offer financial assistance to qualifying microenterprises—small businesses located in Methuen that have 5 or fewer employees, 1 or more of whom owns the enterprise—adversely impacted by COVID-19. Grants of up to \$25,000.00 (effective 4/27/21) for microenterprise businesses for tenant-based rents, commercial mortgages (principal & interest only) and/or utility costs (electric & heating fuels). The grant is designed to aid in maintaining their business and workforce. Methuen Dedicates Dan Ford Field at Nicholson Stadium

Mayor Neil Perry joined local dignitaries, school officials, family, and friends for the dedication of Dan Ford Field at Nicholson Stadium on April 23. The field was dedicated to Dan Ford, a 1988 Methuen high school graduate and standout multi-sport athlete. Dan passed away in 2009 after a long battle with cancer.

Ford was a uniquely strong athlete with great versatility. He eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark in both his junior and senior seasons as a bruising running back for head coach Larry Klimas's Rangers.

In track, he excelled in the quarter mile was a member of Methuen's 4x400 state title team. He was also an outstanding member of the Ranger hockey team. Ford was named Methuen High School's Athlete of the Year in 1988 and was honored with induction into the Methuen High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997. His #42 jersey has been retired by the football program.

In addition to his resume at MHS, Ford played football at the University of New Haven and the University of Lowell. He also achieved legendary status in various regional and local leagues across numerous sports.

Speakers at the event included Mayor Perry, Councilor Joel Faretra who spearheaded the dedication, and Dan Ford's older brother, Mike. Methuen Athletic Director Matt Curran hosted the proceedings. It was a wonderful tribute to a special athlete and person. After the formal dedication, the Ford family (pictured) and their many friends were able to gather on the field in memory and tribute.

Smart911 Alerts Assist First Responders as COVID-19 Continues

Smart911 allows residents to sign up online and provide vital information to 911 call takers during an emergency, allowing first responders to make faster and more informed responses. Residents and visitors can create a safety profile for their whole household that includes any information they might want 911 dispatchers and first responders to have in the event of an emergency, such as allergy information or pre-existing medical conditions.

With the COVID-19 pandemic ongoing, there is even more of a need for first responders to be aware of any pre-existing conditions on emergency calls. Smart911 is private and secure, is only used for emergency responses, and is only made available to the 911 system in the event of an emergency call. Save Money on Your Home Utility Bills with MethuenSaves

The City of Methuen has launched its 2021 Methuen Saves Energy campaign to help residents in the city save money and energy by increasing the energy efficiency at homes and small businesses. The campaign is in partnership with the nonprofit, All In Energy, and Methuen's local electric and natural gas utilities, National Grid and Eversource. The second year of the partnership builds on a successful first year; despite COVID-19 challenges, 559 Methuen households received home energy assessments. Homeowners and renters also used utility incentives to complete more than 300 weatherization projects and over 450 heating/cooling system upgrades.

Methuen Saves Energy is designed to ensure that residents - renters, homeowners, and residential property owners - as well as small businesses and local nonprofits, are receiving the full benefits of the statewide Mass Save® programs. Programs are funded through an "energy efficiency" charge on your monthly utility bills and are sponsored by the Methuen region by electric and natural gas providers National Grid and Eversource. In 2021, Methuen has the opportunity to receive a grant of up to \$20,000 from the sponsors of the Mass Save program if it meets its goals for the year.

"Methuen is ecstatic about our selection for participation in the second year of the MassSave Municipal Partnership Program," said Mayor Neil Perry. "This is a great opportunity to expand the benefits of energy efficiency cost-savings and comfort improvements to even more Methuen residents and small businesses."

The first step for residents and property owners is to sign up for a no-cost home energy assessment, which you can do at MethuenSaves.org. Renters living in a 1-4 unit building who pay their utility bills and owners of 1-4 unit buildings or single family homes can all participate. Property owners of buildings with more than 5 units can also benefit from the Mass Save Multifamily Program at MassSave.com/multifamily.

Additionally, the sponsors of Mass Save are offering 100% off approved insulation for a limited time for all rental units in 1-4 unit buildings. Single family homeowners and single unit/condo owners can get 75-100% off approved insulation, based on income. 

Senior Center Celebrates Older Americans Month

Stormwater Inspection Protects Methuen’s Waterways



Throughout the Spring and early Summer, Methuen DPW teams will be out inspecting stormwater outfall pipes and other drainage structures throughout Methuen. “Outfalls” are the end of the pipe where municipal drainage flows into nearby water bodies, wetlands, or low-lying areas.

The inspections and water sampling are part of Methuen’s Stormwater Management Program to ensure proper maintenance of our storm drain system, prevent pollution of our rivers, streams and water bodies, and meet federal Clean Water Act requirements.

The inspections are being done with the City’s engineering consultant Tighe & Bond. The work will be performed primarily off the roadway where the stormwater pipes discharge to wetlands, streams, or wooded areas. Work may include opening manhole structures within the street. Prueba gratuita de COVID-19 "Stop the Spread" extendida


La Administración Baker-Polito anunció una extensión de la iniciativa COVID-19 "Stop the Spread", que proporciona pruebas de COVID-19 gratuitas en comunidades de todo el Commonwealth, hasta el 30 de Septiembre de 2021.

Desde que el estado comenzó esta prueba de virus gratuita en Julio de 2020, se han realizado más de 1.8 millones de pruebas en ubicaciones de "Stop the Spread" hasta el 3 de Marzo de 2021.
