*New applicants will need to bring income verification (Social Security award letter and/or pension statement), a photo ID, and housing costs (rent/mortgage receipt) Recertifying clients need to bring current copies of all documents previously submitted in last application.*

### Veterinary Pet Care Program

Interacting with animals and pets has been shown to reduce loneliness, boost people's mood and feelings of social support, decrease stress, and even lower blood pressure. Of course, having a pet involves ongoing responsibilities, including medical care, which can be expensive. AgeSpan, through Meals on Wheels America and PetSmart, can help!

#### Who can apply to the program?

- People currently receiving AgeSpan services.
- People 65 and over, not using our services, who qualify financially (Example: \$2,265 monthly income for a single-person household)
- People who reside in one of the 28 cities/towns we serve.



**How much will it cover?** Up to \$300 in one-time veterinary care for pets of those in need, once per year.

**Can I use my current vet?** Yes, if you have one, or AgeSpan will help you coordinate with an approved vet.

**What services are covered?** Rabies and other shots, spaying/neutering, flea/tick care, annual checkups, nail trimming, and more.

### A MESSAGE FROM STATE REPRESENTATIVE RYAN HAMILTON

My name is Ryan Hamilton, State Representative for the 15th Essex district that includes both Haverhill and Methuen. As of the time of my writing this, I have had the privilege of being your Representative for two weeks. Helping the residents of Methuen and Haverhill is why I ran for this office and why I implore all residents of my district to contact me at [Ryan.Hamilton@mahouse.gov](mailto:Ryan.Hamilton@mahouse.gov) when they have questions or need assistance. The purpose of occupying this office is to listen and advocate for those who elected me, no matter what their concern may be. So please reach out if you need help. I look forward to interacting and assisting you with whatever inquiry you have.

My first few days in the State House have allowed me to witness history. On Wednesday, I was sworn in as the youngest member of the House of Representatives and cast my first vote to continue Ron Mariano's leadership of our caucus and state as Speaker of the House. Then on Thursday, I had a front-row seat to a first in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with the swearing-in of Governor Maura Healey and Lieutenant Governor Kim Driscoll. Governor Healey was the first female ever elected to the position of Governor in Massachusetts. I look forward to serving with the Healey-Driscoll administration, and I am hopeful for all the good we will do together for the people of Haverhill and Methuen.

Now, looking towards the future. The next few weeks will be busy. It will be a time at which I will be submitting my first pieces of legislation and being given my committee assignments. I will be hosting my first office hours at the Methuen Senior Center. I will set up my government social media accounts to further share updates with the residents of Methuen and Haverhill.

It's an exciting time to be in public service; the future of Methuen, the Merrimack Valley, and the Commonwealth look bright. I look forward to continuing our dialogue in the Senior Center newsletter. As always, please do not hesitate to reach out if my office can serve you.

Lastly, I would like to thank Representative Linda Dean Campbell for all she has done for our Country during her time in the Army and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a State Representative. Linda has been a constant in advocating and delivering for Haverhill and Methuen during her time in the legislature, and for that, we owe her our gratitude and appreciation!

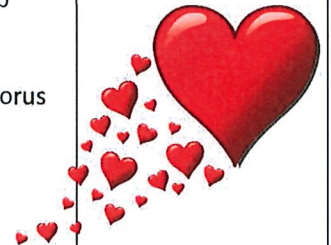
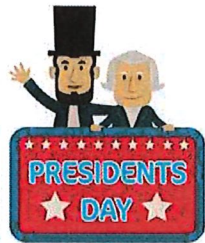

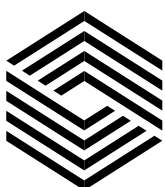
