Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 72 years ago.

The first direct-dial coast to coast telephone call was made. The popular television show “I Love Lucy” premiered on CBS. The first Color Television Pictures are broadcast from Empire State Building.

UNIVAC, the first commercial computer, is put into use at the U.S. Census Bureau and Bobby Thomson’s walk off “Shot Heard ‘Round the World” home run gives the New York Giants the National League pennant over the Brooklyn Dodgers.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1951 and a fire at Old Town Farm.

In the early 1800’s, Methuen was home to a publicly funded town farm. The purpose of the farm was to provide food and housing for needy members of the community.

According to the book “A History of Methuen and its Fire Department” by Retired Methuen Firefighter Kenneth H. Doherty, “Around 1850, Methuen built a new town farm at the end Pelham St. near Hampshire Road. The large two-story brick building remained in that capacity until 1935 when the town built a much larger facility across the street.”

Eventually, the farm building was turned into residential apartments. In 1951, the building was engulfed in flames as the owner accidentally started a fire due to faulty use of a gasoline blowtorch. The challenging and damaging fire destroyed the front of the building top to bottom with damages in the thousands of dollars. The 430 Pelham Street site remains a residential structure today.

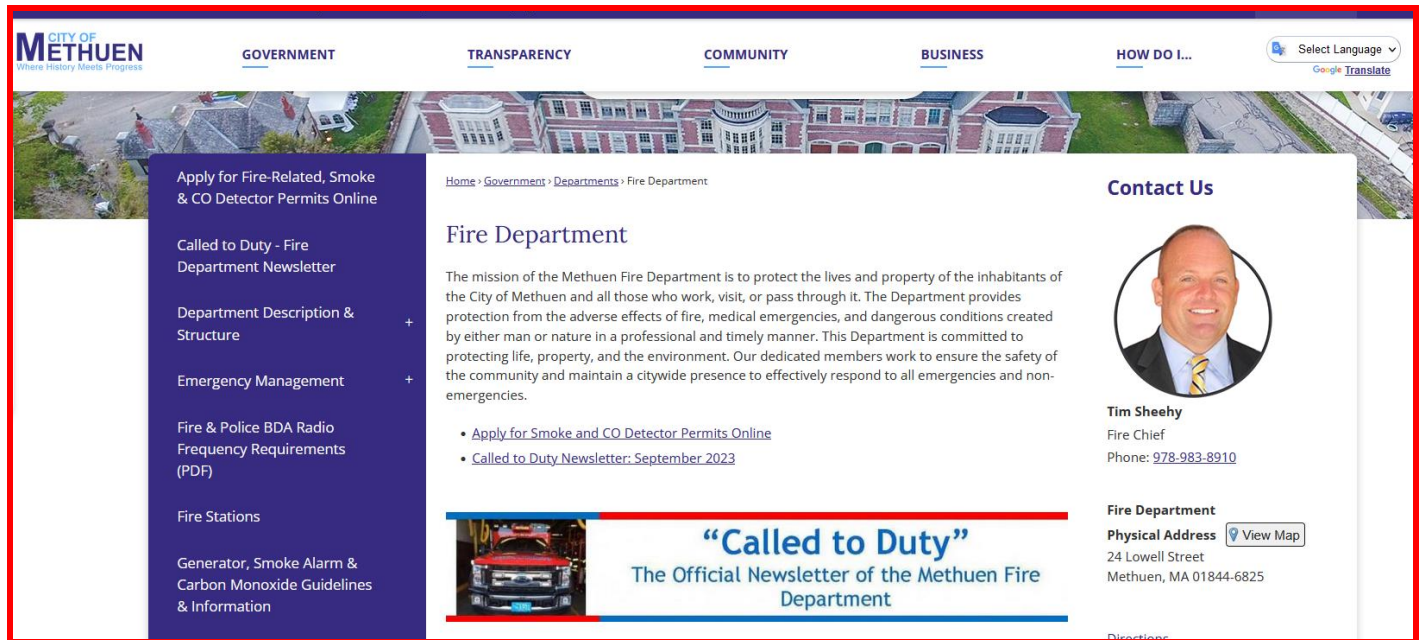
PLEASE DROP OFF ANY OLD FLAGS AT ELMWOOD PRIOR TO THE EVENT!
