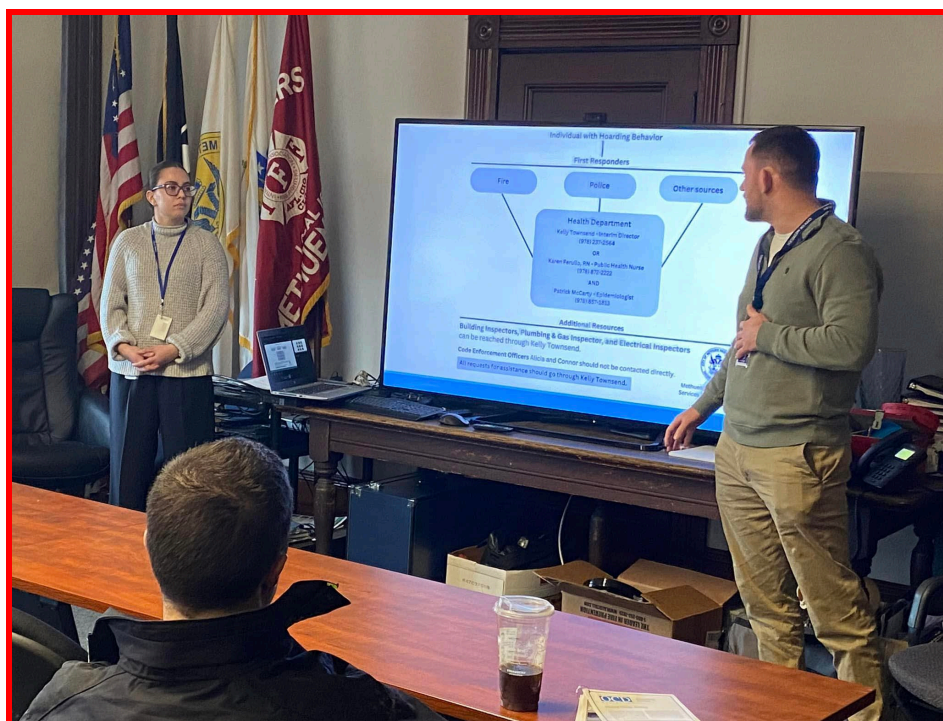

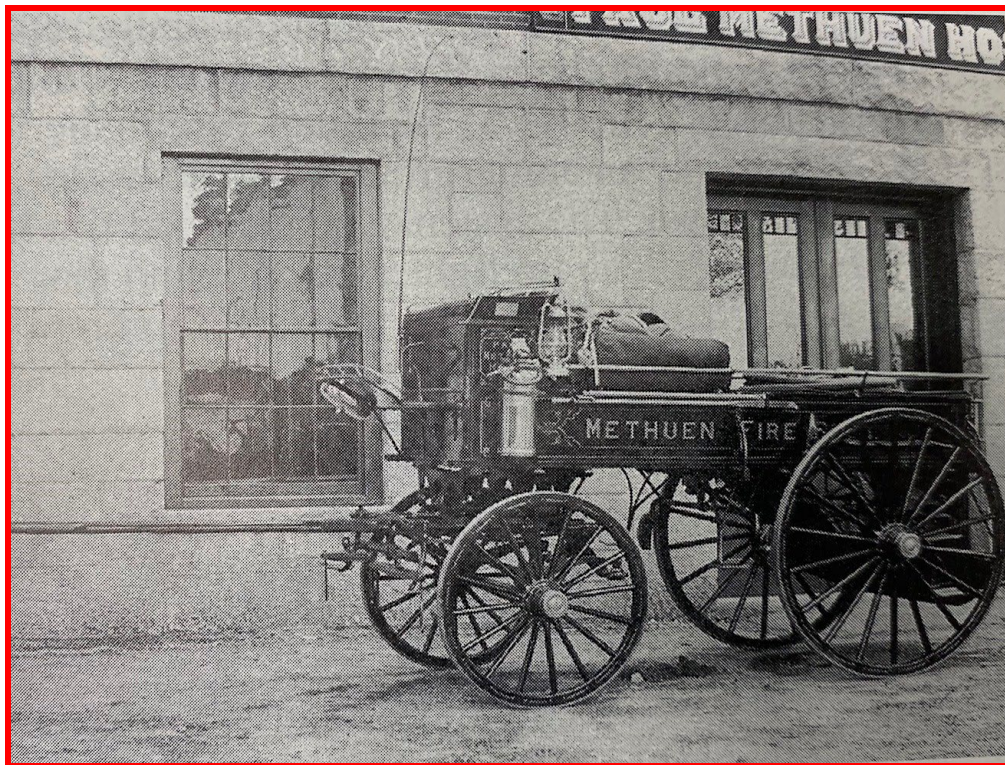

Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 133 years ago.

The US Congress creates the Office of Superintendent of Immigration later known as the Treasury Department. The first world weightlifting championship is won by Edward Lawrence in London, England. The Wrigley Company is founded in Chicago, Illinois.

The 17th Kentucky Derby is won by jockey Isaac Murphy aboard Kingman. Thomas Edison patents the motion picture camera, and the world's first traveler's cheques are issued by American Express.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1891 and the Methuen Fire Department's newly gifted Hose Wagon.

In 1891, one of the founding fathers of Methuen, Edward F. Searles, donated a new hose wagon to the Methuen Fire Department replacing the archaic Mystic Hose Reel. The new hose wagon enabled firefighters to carry hoses, other equipment, and themselves to fires. One stipulation that Mr. Searles had was that the hose company change its name to the Paul Methuen Hose Company in honor of British Nobleman Paul Methuen for whom the town was named.

As it turned out, the hose wagon gifted by Mr. Searles did not have a long life. Just a few years later, it was replaced by the steam fire engine as the Methuen Fire Department's most prominent piece of firefighting equipment.

Spring Storms Bring Downed Power Line Danger



The Methuen Fire Department has already received several calls this spring regarding downed power lines caused by recent wind and storms.

Downed power lines can carry an electric current strong enough to cause serious injury or even death. If you come across a low or fallen line, we urge you to adhere to the following safety tips and please call 911:

- If you see a downed power line, move away from it and anything touching it.
- Assume that all downed power lines are live.
- If you see someone who is in direct or indirect contact with the downed line, do not touch the person. Call 911 for help.
- Do not attempt to move a downed power line or anything else in contact with it.
- Do not drive over downed power lines. If your car comes in contact with a downed power line while you are inside, stay in the car. Honk your horn to summon help, but direct others to stay away from your car.

Our firefighters recently experienced high-voltage emergency response training thanks to a program by the Massachusetts Department of Fire Services (DFS).



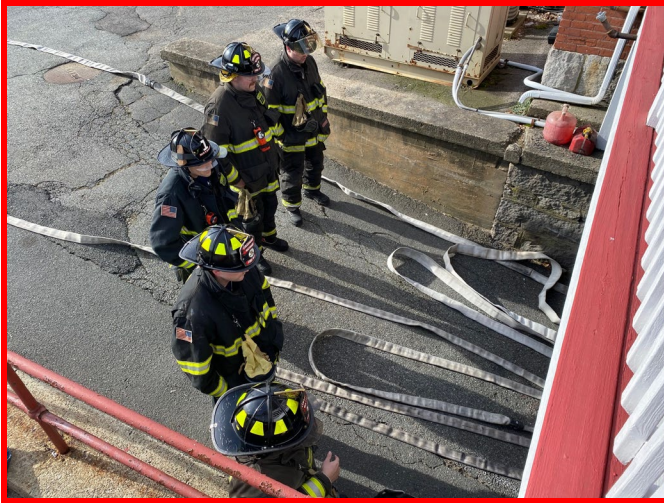
The DFS came to our Central Station and set up an apparatus to show our firefighters the proper techniques and strategies in responding to such an emergency.
