MFD Participates in Flashover Training



Methuen firefighters recently took part in MA Department of Fire Services on-site flashover training. A flashover is a transitional phase that happens between the growth stage and the fully developed stage of a fire. During a flashover, all the objects within a space are heated to their ignition point and the entire space is consumed by fire.



The temperature range in a room when flashover occurs is somewhere between 900 and 1200 degrees F. The heat produced by flashover is not survivable for more than a few seconds, even when wearing full PPE and SCBA. Firefighters are faced with the possibility of a flashover at every fire. Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 35 years ago.

Sports Illustrated reports allegations tying Cincinnati Reds’ legend Pete Rose to baseball gambling. Rose was eventually banned from the game for life. The tanker Exxon Valdez runs aground dumping over 11 million gallons of oil into Alaska’s Prince William Sound.

On August 22, Nolan Ryan strikes out Rickey Henderson to become the first Major League Baseball pitcher to record 5,000 strikeouts. An earthquake measuring 7.1 on the Richter Scale rocks the San Francisco area during the World Series between the A’s and Giants, and the first episode of television series *The Simpsons* airs in the United States.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1989 and a destructive fire at Forster Lumber.


Methuen was once home to several thriving lumber businesses throughout the city. With time and the arrival of nearby large retail home center chains, these small businesses eventually became extinct. One of the last surviving lumber businesses in Methuen was Forster Lumber which was situated at 37 1/2 Oakland Ave. In 1989 several buildings on the property along with a large quantity of stock were destroyed in a widespread fire.

The accompanying photo is a view looking down from the Oakland Avenue entrance of the business. As the photo shows, the storage building on the left is fully engorged in flames. Smaller buildings were also destroyed but amazingly, the office and retail areas did not suffer any significant damage. After the violent fire, Forster Lumber reopened but never fully recovered, eventually defeated by the larger businesses and a sluggish economy. The business closed its door for good in 1993. New England Outdoor Custom Built Structures now resides on the property.

Spring Storms Bring Downed Power Line Danger



Stay away
from downed
power lines.

The Methuen Fire Department has already received several calls this season regarding downed power lines caused by wind and storms.

Downed power lines can carry an electric current strong enough to cause serious injury or even death. If you come across a low or fallen line, we urge you to adhere to the following safety tips and please call 911:

- If you see a downed power line, move away from it and anything touching it.
- Assume that all downed power lines are live.
- If you see someone who is in direct or indirect contact with the downed line, do not touch the person. Call 911 for help.
- Do not attempt to move a downed power line or anything else in contact with it.
- Do not drive over downed power lines. If your car comes in contact with a downed power line while you are inside, stay in the car. Honk your horn to summon help, but direct others to stay away from your car.

MFD Urges Caution During Lawrence Street Construction



Now through October 4, 2024, please use caution when driving or walking in the Lawrence Street and Charles Street areas. The Roadway and Parking Improvement Project in these areas is underway.



Lawrence St. from Charles St. to the intersection with Park St., and Charles St. from the intersection with Broadway to Pleasant St. will experience traffic delays due to re-routing and temporary closures. Seeking alternate routes is recommended.


