

## Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 28 years ago.

Princess Diana and Prince Charles are officially divorced. Major League Soccer makes its debut in the United States with the San Jose Clash facing D.C. United

Nintendo releases their newest gaming system the Nintendo 64. The Summer Olympics are held in Atlanta and a Nail Bomb explodes in Centennial Olympic Park. The Dallas Cowboys win their third Super Bowl in four years, and some of the most popular films are *Independence Day*, *Twister*, *Mission: Impossible*, and *Jerry Maguire*.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1996 and the publication of an important written history of our department.

*A History of Methuen and its Fire Department: 150 years of Service 1846-1996* was written by now-retired Methuen Firefighter Kenneth H. Doherty (pictured above left) and published by Eagle Offset Printers in 1996. Doherty dedicated the book to former Methuen Fire Captain William S Quinn. In 1914, Quinn's father John was the first Methuen firefighter to lose his life while fighting a fire. The younger Quinn joined the MFD following his return from World War I. He held the position of Captain until his retirement in 1953 and remained active in Methuen until his passing.

Doherty's book provides an all-encompassing history of the Methuen Fire Department. The many photos in the book are from Doherty's personal collection as well as the Methuen Historical Museum, Fire Department, Historical Society, and other sources. Doherty's passion for the fire department comes through in every well-crafted word on the book's pages. From advances in equipment and personnel to detailed accounts of Methuen fires through the years, this book has become a valuable reference material for anyone interested in the history of our Fire Department and our city.

## MFD Firefighter Memorial Sunday Tradition Continues

On June 9, the Methuen Fire Department renewed its annual Firefighter Sunday tradition. Family, friends, and local dignitaries joined members of our department in remembering dearly departed Methuen Firefighters and celebrating department promotions and our annual scholarship winners.
