## Methuen Fire Department Urges Portable Generator Safety



Winter weather means potential power outages and the use of portable generators. These tools can be helpful when the power goes out for an extended period of time, but it is important to know how use them safely to prevent fires, carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, and electrocution.

The Methuen Fire Department receives numerous emergency calls each year emanating from improper portable generator usage. When using a generator, remember to purchase one that has been approved by a nationally recognized testing agency such as Underwriter's Laboratory (UL). Have a licensed electrician install a transfer switch. Never plug a generator directly into a wall outlet to avoid backfeeding which can electrocute utility workers. Read and follow the manufacturer's instructions before you need to use the generator and install working CO alarms on every level of the home. ## Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 34 years ago.

The Hubble Space Telescope is launched as the first sophisticated optical observatory placed into orbit around Earth. The Persian Gulf War begins as Iraq invades neighboring Kuwait.

Nelson Mandela is released from Drakenstein Correctional Centre outside Cape Town, South Africa after 27 years as a political prisoner. Dr. Jack Kevorkian participates in his first assisted suicide. George Steinbrenner is forced by Commissioner Fay Vincent to resign as principal partner of the New York Yankees, and the Edmonton Oilers beat the Boston Bruins in five games to win their 5<sup>th</sup> Stanley Cup in 7 years.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1990 and the creation of a Fire Department patch to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the MFD.

In preparation of the celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the Methuen Fire Department, the Anniversary Committee in 1990 wanted to devise a special anniversary logo.

According to the book *A History of Methuen and its Fire Department* by Retired Methuen Firefighter Kenneth H. Doherty, the design chosen featured a drawing of a 1922 Tiger engine. Now-retired Methuen Firefighter David Collier drew the engine from a 1989 photograph sent by the Milo, ME Fire Department.

The anniversary committee also asked Methuen High School Students to design a patch, and Michael Stumpo's entry featuring a waving American flag was chosen. Subsequently, our firefighters voted to place Collier's drawing of the Tiger engine over Stumpo's flag to complete the anniversary patch design.




## Methuen Fire Department at Methuen Santa Parade


